

APPLYING FOR A PASSPORT - STEP BY STEP

First time Applicants (over 18 years of age)

1. Applicants must apply in person

• Make sure you must apply in person (Form DS-11).

You must use the <u>DS-11 Form</u> if this is your first passport **or** your last passport was lost/stolen/damaged, issued when you were under 16, or issued more than 15 years ago.

2. Fill out the DS-11—print single-sided, don't sign yet.

Complete the form online or download it, print on single-sided paper, and wait
to sign until the acceptance agent tells you to. You can request a passport book,
card, or both. For mission trips, you'll only need a <u>Passport Book</u>.

3. Gather proof of U.S. citizenship (original) + a photocopy.

 Acceptable examples include a certified U.S. birth certificate, a full-validity prior U.S. passport, Consular Report of Birth Abroad, Certificate of Naturalization, or Certificate of Citizenship. Digital/mobile documents aren't accepted; bring the physical original and a black-and-white photocopy.

4. Bring photo ID (original) + a photocopy.

• A driver's license is typical. If the ID is from a different state than where you apply, bring a second photo ID. Photocopy front and back on 8.5"×11" paper (single-sided, black-and-white).

5. Get one compliant passport photo.

- Color, taken within the last 6 months, 2"×2" with a plain white/off-white background. No glasses; neutral expression; head size roughly 1–13/8" from chin to top of head. Printed on photo-quality paper. Don't staple it—your agent will.
- You can easily get this taken at a local CVS or if applying at the Courthouse, they have an option of them taking it for you for a fee.

6. Calculate and prepare fees (two separate payments).

- **Application fee** (paid to "U.S. Department of State" by check/money order):
 - Adult book \$130 card \$30 book + card \$160



- Acceptance/execution fee (paid to the facility): \$35 (payment methods vary by location, typically credit/debit cards are accepted).
- Optional: **Expedite** \$60; **1–2 day return delivery** \$22.05.

7. Book an appointment and apply in person.

- Go to a passport acceptance facility (post office, clerk of court, library, etc.). The
 agent will verify your documents, give you an oath, and have you sign; they'll
 send your application for processing. (Use the official locator to find a site near
 you.)
- 8. Choose processing speed (current timelines).
 - Routine: 4–6 weeks
 - Expedited: 2–3 weeks (add \$60)

9. Track your application.

- You'll get email updates; you can also check status online. Mailing to and from the agency isn't included in the processing time—build in extra time (mail can add "2 weeks each way).
- 10. Watch your mail.
 - Your passport and your citizenship evidence are returned in separate mailings (and sometimes on different days).

Passport Renewals

- 1. If you're renewing your expired passport, you can renew online or by mail.

Applying for an applicant under 16 years of age

- Use DS-11 Form, and the child and both parents/guardians must appear in person (or provide proper consent paperwork if one can't attend: Form DS-3053).
 Bring proof of the child's U.S. citizenship, proof of parent/guardian relationship, both parents' photo IDs (plus photocopies), and one compliant photo.
