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

Welcome to Your Formation Group

We are so glad you have chosen to join us on this journey of spiritual growth! Over the next few weeks, we believe that this group will not only be a resource for *information*, but also a catalyst for *transformation*. Our hope is that through integrating these principles and practices into your everyday routines, you will begin to experience the "life" that Jesus speaks about in John 10:10... "I have come that they may have life, and have it to the full!"

Weekly Rhythm

Throughout this formation group, several things make up your weekly rhythm. First, you will **learn** by watching the weekly video teachings. As you watch each session, we encourage you to take notes in this guide to help you remember what God is speaking to you about and what you are learning. After your group, you will have an opportunity to put what you learned into **practice**. This is an essential part of the formation process as we apply the lessons from God's Word. After you have completed the practice for that week, take some time to **reflect** on your experience through journaling. Write out what went well, what was challenging, and how you can continue to grow in this daily. Finally, as you come back to your small group, you will have an opportunity to **process together** about your experience with the practices. Share your progress and challenges on your journey to be formed into the image of Christ.



SOAP Explanation

Scripture

- Select a plan. (New Testament reading plan or Life journal reading plan are great options)
- While you read, choose one verse or passage that sticks out to you and write it down.

Example: And we know that all things work together for good to those who love God, to those who are the called according to His purpose. Romans 8:28

Observation

Once you have finished writing down the passage that you would like to focus on, take a moment to write down what you observe about the passage.

• What sticks out to you? Why did you select this passage? What is God saying to you through this Scripture?

Example: God doesn't just work out some things, He works out <u>all things</u>. No matter how challenging a situation or circumstance, He will work it together for good.

Application

After you write down the Scripture as well as the observation, take a moment to write out how you could apply this to your life this week. Get specific as you commit to living out the truth found in this passage.

Example: When I face certain challenges this week, I need to remember that God will work out all things for His good. I will choose to trust Him in every situation.

Prayer

Finally, end by writing a prayer pertaining to this passage. This is a great opportunity to process with God about this passage. If you feel like God is speaking to you through it, talk to Him about it. This is also a great time to ask the Holy Spirit to help you apply this to your life. To have God's Word transform you, you'll need more than just willpower; you need the Spirit's power.

Example: God, thank You for your promise to work all things together. Even when I can't see it, I choose to trust You in each situation I face, no matter how difficult the circumstances. Your ways are better than mine, and I choose to trust in Your goodness and righteousness.
