

Foreword

I grew up in Metairie, Louisiana—just outside New Orleans. Each spring, my brother and I did something peculiar. Under the watchful eye of my parents, we would grab our shovels and move dirt against—and even under—the foundation of our home. If you're not from south Louisiana, you may ask, "Why in the world would you do that?" I'll tell you why. It was necessary to keep our home from sinking into the moist Louisiana soil. Encouragement for Small Group Leaders

Thank you for stepping out and leading a *Foundations* small group! Because of your willingness to lead, your group members will gain a greater understanding of the Bible and deepen their relationship with God and others. Here are a few tips to get your group started:

- Use the Small Group Discussion section found at the end of each chapter. These questions are designed to create engaging discussions that foster connections between each group member while they grow in their relationship with God.
- Familiarize yourself with the chapters, videos, and discussion questions before your group meets. Group members should watch the video lessons and complete the chapter before your group gathers.
- Before you begin the discussion questions, start off with a time of connection. This is how your small group members can start building relationships with each other. After this time, take the next 5-10 minutes to check-in with each other. Consider asking icebreaker questions to stimulate conversation. As you check-in, allow members to share about their readings during the week's lesson.

• After your discussion, end the group with prayer. Allow members to share prayer requests and updates from their week. Spend a few minutes praying for and with each other.

The Bible

What is the Bible? If you've asked this question, you're not alone. Millions throughout generations have also wondered what the Bible is. Simply put, we believe the Bible is God's Word. It is unique among all literature ever written because the Bible alone is "God-breathed." 2 Timothy 3:16 (NKJV) says, All Scripture is given by inspiration of God, and is profitable for doctrine, for reproof, for correction, for instruction in righteousness. The New Testament of the Bible was originally written in the Greek language. The phrase "inspiration of God" is translated from two Greek words joined together to form a single word—theopneustos. The word theo means "God," and the word pneustos means "breath." Together they mean "God-breathed." All Scripture—the entire Bible—is God-breathed Word. 2 Timothy 3:16 is saying that the Bible is not merely the words of people, but the infallible and inspired words which have come straight from the mouth of God.

The Bible is not merely a book of instructions. Yes, it does contain instructions and commands. Yet, the purpose of the Bible is to teach us how to have healthy relationships with God and others. It is a record of how God interacted with people throughout history. If you have a Bible, you have probably noticed it is divided into two major sections: the Old Testament and the New Testament. The Old Testament contains 39 individual books which detail God's interactions with people from the creation of the world until about 400 years before the birth of Jesus Christ. The New Testament is formed from 27

books beginning with accounts about Jesus' life on earth and ends with an account about how He is coming again. The New Testament teaches us how to have a loving relationship with Jesus and others. You can find more information about the Bible and Bible translations in the appendix at the end of this workbook.

The Bible is a fascinating book, yet it can be challenging to understand at times. The first step for understanding the Bible is reading it. But you are not alone in your Bible-engagement journey. We are here to help. In fact, that's what *Foundations* is all about—helping you grow in your relationship with God and others by putting into practice the teachings of the Bible. So, are you ready? Let's begin!
